<u>PROPOSED ACTION</u>: Ordinance: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Execute an *Airline Operating Agreement* and its *Annex "A" Space/Use Permit* with Advanced Air, LLC, with Anticipated Revenues of \$191,627.45, Operating at San Francisco Bay Oakland International Airport and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. (Aviation)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Advanced Air, a domestic carrier headquartered in Hawthorne, California commenced daily essential air service to Crecent City, CA from San Francisco Bay Oakland International Airport (OAK or Airport) in March 2024. This action would approve and authorize the Executive Director to: 1) approve the terms and conditions of the Port's standardized *Airline Operating Agreement* and its *Annex "A" Space/Use Permit* with Advanced Air, LLC (Advanced Air); and 2) authorize the Executive Director to execute the *Airline Operating Agreement* and *Annex "A" Space/Use Permit*.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

The *Airline Operating Agreement* (AOA) provides the terms and conditions for scheduled passenger and cargo airline operations at OAK. All airlines subject to these agreements pay fees to the Airport pursuant to the Port's annual Rates & Charges ordinance. For consistency, all AOA's have a concurrent expiration date of September 30, 2026, subject to the right of either party to terminate upon 30 days written notice.

Advanced Air is headquartered in Hawthorne, California and operates scheduled commuter service to various destinations throughout Arizona, California, Nevada, and New Mexico. On January 3, 2024, Advanced Air was selected by the Border Coast Regional Airport Authority Board to provide Essential Air Service (EAS)¹ from Crescent City, CA to OAK.

The current ESA authorization for Advanced Air's Crescent City to Oakland operation is from March 17, 2024 through September 29, 2024. Advanced Air operates daily nonstop flights from Oakland to Crescent City, flying a 30-passenger Dornier 328 Jet. The Airport is projected to collect from Advanced Air approximately \$176,524.48 in aircraft landing

and common use fees, and \$15,102.97 in exclusive use space rental for 88 square feet of office space (Category II rate) during this period.² Advanced Air has provided a total deposit of \$87,000 to the Port of Oakland for both agreements.
