PROPOSED ACTION: Resolution: Approving Cal/OES Form 130 to Designate Authorized Agents for a Reimbursement Request From a FEMA Disaster Assistance Program, and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: In 2023, the Port of Oakland (Port) submitted a reimbursement request under a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Disaster Assistance Program related to the Port's support of a federally coordinated emergency response for disembarkation and transport of passengers from the Grand Princess Cruise Ship in 2020. As part of the reimbursement process, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal/OES) requires approval of Cal/OES Form 130 (Form 130) to designate authorized agents to receive the reimbursement funds. This action requests Board of Port Commissioners' (Board) approval of this form to meet the final administrative requirement necessary for reimbursement.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

In March 2020, the Port of Oakland supported the docking, disembarkation, and transport of thousands of passengers from the Grand Princess Cruise Ship affected by COVID-19 including use of its Aviation, Maritime, and Emergency Operations Center facilitates and staff resources from across the Port. This federally coordinated operation was led by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), FEMA, and Cal/OES, and facilitated the safe movement of thousands of passengers to destinations across the United States.

In response to this emergency operation, the Port submitted a reimbursement request under FEMA Disaster Assistance Program DR-4482-CA. To complete the reimbursement process, Cal/OES requires approval of Form 130, which designates the Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer as signatories and authorized agents to interact with Cal/OES and FEMA as it relates to Form 130 and the reimbursement process on behalf of the Port of Oakland. A copy of Form 130, in the form of approval, is attached to this Agenda Report.

Port Staff requests Board approval of Form 130 so that the Port can proceed with closing out the reimbursement process.
