PROPOSED ACTION: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Execute an Agreement with the City of Oakland for Police Patrol Services in the Hegenberger Road and 98th Avenue Airport Corridors for Up to Twelve Months for a Maximum Compensation Not to Exceed \$325,000 and Finding That the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Port of Oakland (Port) previously executed agreements with the City of Oakland (City) to provide police patrol services in the Hegenberger Road and 98th Avenue corridors between Interstate Highway 880 and Oakland San Francisco Bay Airport (OAK) using only available overtime and Port funding to ensure no impact to other City police services. These police patrol services are instrumental in deterring crime and keeping passengers, employees, and visitors, travelling to and from OAK safe and secure. Port Staff recommends continuing to contract with the City to provide police patrol services in these two corridors through January 2027.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

Through agreements between the City and Port dated December 17, 2024, and April 1, 2025, the Port contracted with the City to provide police patrol services in the two main corridors connecting Interstate Highway 880 and OAK to deter crime and provide enhanced safety for passengers, visitors, and employees using and working at OAK. The frequency and location of patrols are coordinated between the Oakland Police Department (OPD) and the Port's Aviation Security Department. OPD provides these services using officers on overtime only as available so as to not impact any other OPD services to the City. All services rendered are paid by the Port. The latest agreement is set to expire on January 31, 2026.

Port Staff recommends continuing to contract with the City / OPD to provide police patrol services in these two main corridors through January 2027. Continued police presence will deter criminal activity and assist in keeping passengers, visitors, and employees using and working at OAK safe and secure and support safety in the area. All police services will be coordinated by the Port's Aviation Security Department. The Port will continue to reimburse the City for the actual direct overtime cost of police services rendered with no additional costs. The cost is estimated not to exceed \$325,000.
