PROPOSED ACTION: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Award and Execute a Contract with Koffler Electrical Mechanical Apparatus Repair, Inc. for Container Cranes Large Electric Motor Maintenance, Repair, Reconditioning, Overhaul, and Replacement Services for Port of Oakland-Owned Cranes for an amount Not-To-Exceed \$900,000 Commencing January 1, 2026 and Ending December 31, 2028, 2029, or 2030; and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Port of Oakland (Port) is obligated to maintain certain Port-owned cranes at its Seaport terminals. The Port regularly solicits proposals for services to support this specialty work. These contracts are highly effective and flexible for as-needed and annual support services required to maintain Port-owned cranes.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

The Port is obligated through various leases to maintain certain Port-owned container cranes at its Seaport terminals such as OICT and Trapac. To meet this obligation, Port Staff mobilizes a vendor on an as-needed basis to perform maintenance, repair, reconditioning, overhaul, and replacement services on large electric motors on Port-owned cranes.

The current contract is set to expire on December 31, 2025. The requested contract will allow the Port to continue the as-needed electric motor services of large electric motors on Port-owned cranes.

On October 2, 2025, the Port issued and posted on its website a Request for Proposal for container cranes large electric motors maintenance, repair, reconditioning, overhaul, and replacement services contract. The scope of work of the requested contract includes, but is not limited to, providing labor, materials, and equipment required to maintain, repair,

recondition, overhaul, or replace large electric motors for Port-owned container cranes based on motor manufacturer specifications and motor nameplate information, using current industry standards and best practices.

The Port received one proposal on November 12, 2025, as noted below.

The Port Staff evaluation committee found Koffler's proposal to be complete and responsive. Koffler is a certified Local Impact Area business and a Small Business Enterprise. Two additional one-year extensions are requested to allow Port Staff to efficiently use any remaining contract authority after the first three years for ongoing maintenance before needing to issue a new request for proposals and preparing a new contract.
