<u>PROPOSED ACTION</u>: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Execute an Agreement with Mythics, LLC dba Mythics VII, LLC for Oracle Enterprise Resources Planning Software Maintenance and Support for a Term of Five Years for an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,446,333 and finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Port of Oakland (Port) uses Oracle Corporation's Enterprise Resource Planning (Oracle ERP) system for finance and human resources functions. The current software maintenance and support licensing agreement for the Oracle ERP system expires on April 29, 2025. Authorization is requested to renew the Port's Oracle ERP software maintenance and support licensing agreement for up to five-years through Mythics, LLC dba Mythics VII, LLC (Mythics).

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

The Port uses Oracle's ERP system as the primary software system for managing the Port's finance, payroll, human resources, procurement, assets, projects, and property functions. A maintenance and support licensing agreement is necessary for the Port to receive operational support with needed bug fixes, quarterly security patch releases, technology upgrades, and annually required payroll patch releases.

Cooperative Purchase Agreement

While researching the best option for the Port's ERP software support and maintenance agreement, Port Staff identified a cooperative purchase agreement through OMNIA Partners (formerly US Communities) with Mythics for Oracle products support, services, and solutions. Maricopa County, Arizona conducted the competitive solicitation and awarded the cooperative purchase agreement based on their competitive procurement procedures. Port of Oakland Administrative Code, Section 5.12.070.D.4, provides that formal competitive procurement requirements shall not apply to "[c]contracts for the same Supplies or Services awarded by ... another governmental agency provided the award of the contract was based on that agency's published competitive procurement or bidding procedures and not based on the waiver of such competitive procedures." Port Staff has reviewed the cooperative purchase agreement and recommends leveraging its terms for the Port's benefit.
