PROPOSED ACTION: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Award and Execute Contracts with Andrew M Jordan Inc. DBA A&B Construction, D-Line Constructors, Inc., Marinship Development Interest LLC, McGuire and Hester, and A. Teichert & Son, Inc. DBA Teichert Construction for On-Call Civil Utility Infrastructure Construction in the Aggregate Amount Not to Exceed of \$15,000,000 Commencing September 1, 2025 and Ending August 31, 2026, 2027, or 2028; and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On-call contracts are an essential tool for performing certain Port of Oakland (Port) work. The Port has many capital improvement projects scheduled, and expense projects anticipated, for which the on-call contracts will be key to delivering on time. Port Staff recently solicited new bids for up to five civil utility infrastructure construction (CUIC) contractors. Port Staff seeks authorization for the Executive Director to award and execute CUIC contracts in a total amount not to exceed of \$15,000,000; for the period commencing September 1, 2025, and ending August 31, 2026, 2027, or 2028.

## **BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS**

On-call contracts are essential tools in delivering the Port's projects and programs. Each project is separately authorized by a formal work authorization with multiple layers of approval in accordance with all Port policies and best practices. Port Staff anticipates a variety of projects over the next three years including construction of lift station and pump house upgrades. To best meet these demands over the next three years, Port Staff completed a formal procurement process for these services.

On April 28, 2025, the Port issued invitations to bid on on-call CUIC contracts. On June 11, 2025, the Port received seven formal bids for CUIC contracts. The bids were subject

to the Port's Non-Discrimination and Small Local Business Utilization Policy (NDSLBUP). Table 1 summarizes the bids, indicates the bid discount percentages under the NDSLBUP, and identifies the number of businesses that are certified Local Impact Area (LIA), Local Business Area (LBA), Small Business Enterprise (SBE) and Very Small Business Enterprise (VSBE).
