PROPOSED ACTION: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Execute Professional Services Agreements with Consolidated Engineering Laboratories and Construction Testing Services for On-Call Material Testing and Construction Inspection Services for Non-Federally Funded Projects and Inspection Services, Inc. and Ninyo & Moore Geotechnical & Environmental Science Consultants for On-Call Material Testing and Construction Inspection Services for Federally Funded Projects, for Three-Year Terms with an Aggregate Maximum Compensation for All Agreements Not to Exceed \$3,000,000 and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On-call contracts are an essential tool for performing certain Port of Oakland (Port) work. The Port has numerous construction projects planned as the Port seeks to replace and rehabilitate aging infrastructure. Port Staff have recently conducted a formal procurement process, soliciting proposals for on-call material testing and construction inspection services (MTCIS) to support this work. The total contract authorization amount reflects the scope and number of planned projects as well as flexibility for new projects that may emerge during the term. As with other on-call contracts having multiple firms afford the greatest flexibility for the Port and opportunity for firms to participate.

## **BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS**

On-call contracts are essential tools in delivering the Port's projects and programs. Each project is separately authorized by a formal technical service order with multiple layers of approval in accordance with all Port policies and best practices. To best meet the demand for MTCIS anticipated in the next three years, Port Staff completed a formal procurement process for these services.

On July 26, 2024, the Port issued requests for proposals (RFP) for on-call MTCIS for both federally funded (FF) and non-federally funded (NFF) projects. On August 30, 2024, the Port received six proposals for MTCIS for FF projects, two of which were non-responsive, and five proposals for MTCIS for NFF projects, one of which was non-responsive.

A Committee of Port Staff reviewed and scored the remaining four proposals for MTCIS for FF based on the criteria set forth in the RFQ, as shown in Table 1.
