<u>PROPOSED ACTION</u>: Resolution: Approve and Authorize the Executive Director to Enter into an Agreement with Questivity, Inc. (or the Next Lowest Responsive and Responsible Bidder) to Renew VMware Licensing/Support for Three Years for an Amount Not to Exceed \$479,938.56 (or Next Corresponding Low Bid Amount); and Finding that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. (Technology & Innovation)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Port of Oakland (Port) uses VMware products to run its server infrastructure. The current VMware licensing/support agreement is set to expire on July 31, 2025. Questivity, Inc. (Questivity) submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid to renew for three years.

BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS

The Port uses technology from VMware that allow multiple servers to run "virtually" on single physical servers. This technology allows the Port to increase server hardware utilization, reduce costs, simplify management, improve disaster recovery capabilities, and quickly increase or reduce servers as needed. Port Staff anticipates continued and increased usage of VMware products during the term of the agreement, as they are an industry standard solution and market leaders in the virtualization field.

It is essential that the Port renew licensing and support for the VMware products currently being used. Without the renewal, the Port would no longer be licensed to operate the current server inventory. Moreover, Port Staff would no longer have access to VMware support services, which are necessary to keep Port technology operations running.

VMware licensing agreements also provides the Port with the following benefits:

- Security and functional patches, enhancements, updates, and new versions
- Flexibility to respond to changing business priorities
- Improved manageability of our licensing

Port Staff conducted a formal bid process (#24-25/29) in June 2025. The results of the solicitation for the 3-year renewal are as follows:

Questivity was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and is approved by VMware as an authorized reseller. Should the Port and Questivity not be successful in executing a mutually agreeable agreement, Port staff requests authority to negotiate with the next lowest responsive and responsible bidder(s) until an agreement is reached.
