<u>PROPOSED ACTION</u>: Resolution: Approve the Port of Oakland Sanitary Sewer System Corrective Action Work Plan, Delegate Authority to the Executive Director to Approve Future Amendments to the Corrective Action Work Plan and Find that the Proposed Action is Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act. (Engineering)

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The Port of Oakland (Port) must maintain a Sanitary Sewer System Corrective Action Work Plan (CAWP) as part of the requirements of the Port's Private Sewer Lateral Ordinance (Port PSL Ordinance). Port Staff previously prepared a Condition Assessment Plan (CAP) and is now near completion of fully executing that plan, including an extensive assessment of the majority of its sanitary sewer system assets. In parallel, Staff have made significant progress on rehabilitation and replacement of the Port's sanitary sewer system expediting improvements deemed appropriate based on the assessments. Staff has also now completed the CAWP for Board of Port Commissioner (Board) Approval.

# **BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS**

The Board adopted the Port PSL Ordinance (Ordinance 4474) on May 10, 2018. The Port PSL Ordinance requires Port tenants to comply with PSL regulations promulgated by the City of Oakland (City) and the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) as modified to apply to the Port Area and Port-owned land. The Port PSL Ordinance also directs Port staff to prepare a Port Condition Assessment Plan (CAP) to assess Port-controlled PSLs. Upon completion of the CAP, the Port PSL Ordinance also requires Port Staff to prepare a Port Corrective Action Work Plan (CAWP) which describes the type, quantity, and schedule of work needed to bring all Port controlled sewer assets into compliance with EBMUD maintenance standards.

The CAP was completed and adopted and the Board on June 13, 2019, via Resolution 19-45. Staff has now completed and seeks Board approval of the CAWP. Staff further seeks delegation of authority to the Executive Director to make future amendments to the CAWP. Amendments may include, but are not limited to, changes to project status,

scheduled completion dates, method of rehabilitation, additions or deletions of segments, designation of Legally Responsible Official.

The CAWP reflects the approximate timeline to rehabilitate and replace specific sewer segments. The rehabilitation and replacement of future sewer segments is also programmed in the FY 2024-2028 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) (past work was included in prior years' CIPs). Efforts to rehabilitate and replace the sewers started around the time of the completion of the CAP and well ahead of the development of the CAWP. As a result, Port Staff is pleased to note that a considerable number of the sewer segments identified in the CAWP are either completed, in design, or in construction. Most of the remaining construction is scheduled to take place in FY 2023/2024 and FY 2024/2025 and taper to completion in FY 2025/2026.
